#### **John Foss**

It is with great sadness that we tell CDRC members that John Foss died at the end of November.

It was nearly 35 years ago, in 1986, that John's wife, Ann, was asked to set up a riding club at Langshot. John had his horse, Highlight, on livery there and it was an obvious base for a club. It started as Langshot Riding Club, but very quickly transformed into Chobham and District and affiliated with the British Riding Clubs movement. It was impossible for John to escape involvement and he became both the Chairman and Treasurer. Between them, they were the driving force in getting the club up and running.

Both John and Ann stayed as core members of the committee right through to 2002, when they decided it was time to step back and let new faces take the club onwards. Those of us involved in the Committee during their tenure will have fond memories of meetings at their bungalow. Ann providing the refreshments, always with chocolate biscuits, and John presiding over a sometimes excitable bunch of equestrian ladies.

When John tapped the arm of his chair with his pipe we knew that maybe our enthusiasm had slightly run away with us.

However, stepping back from the CDRC committee by no means meant that John and Ann stepped away from either our club or the riding clubs movement. They remained actively interested in all that CDRC was doing and looked forward to receiving the newsletters to keep up with all that was going on. It was a pleasure to welcome them to our dressage at Merrist Wood in 2019.

John was also the Treasurer for Area II for many years and, with Ann, ran the London and South East Dressage to Music Championship at Sands farm from the early 90s up to 2013.

Our thoughts and deepest sympathies go to Ann, John's wife of more than 50 years.

#### **National lockdown**

From 2 December, BRC activities can resume across all Tiers. (Surrey is Tier 2)

Being in Tier 2 mean a Maximum of six people from any number of households can be at a training venue.

It should be noted that your individual Tier is taken from your home address, not where your horse is kept. If you live in a Tier 1 or Tier 3 area please consult the regulations about travelling into other Tiers.

# RENEWAL MEMBERSHIP

As discussed at the AGM held earlier in the year, British Riding clubs have increased the membership fees and as a result we have had to increase our fees to £24 for the year, which is equivalent to £2 a month. Membership entitles you to enter any CDRC organised event at reduced prices, including our shows. You will also be insured at any BRC run event, including training and receive a quarterly instalment of news, information and articles exclusively for BRC members.

If you do not re-join by 31 January, you will need to pay the additional £10 administration fee on top of the annual payment as per our constitution.
