2022 has been an active year with over 30 training sessions, 3 shows and 4 other events run. We ended the year with 126 members, a very healthy total.

The training sessions have included the ever-popular Flatwork sessions with Suzanne Holt, Polework and Jumping with Tracey Cooper, Showing and Working Hunter/Jumping with Aime Fitzsimons.

Many thanks to those who organised these sessions, Liz, Paul, Amelia and Aime. Also thanks to Celia Macalister who has allowed us to use Larkenshaw as a base for the flatwork sessions, Tracey for use of her facilities and Aime for making Poplar Grove available.

There were also some one-off sessions including the Formation Riding that took place at 12 Oaks, Cross Country at Tweseldown and Groundwork with Ella Louise Mayhead. The unmounted Pilates series taken by Ali Williamson was popular and it is continuing, supplemented by a Fitness "Boot Camp" introduced for this year. Our Charity Show in June was well attended and we were able to make donations of £1,650 to Quest RDA and £500 to Kent, Surrey and Sussex Air Ambulance. That show needs a lot of helpers, so thank you to everyone who came along, whether for a few hours or all day, your help is much appreciated. Special mention must go to Paul, who masterminded the show organisation, and Amelia, the Show Secretary.

The May dressage show made a small loss, but we were back in profit again for the October dressage. It was good to see members competing in all classes at the latter show, and we had the most number of teams since we've been running these shows, with 11 coming forward for this friendly competition. Thank you to Malcolm who was responsible for getting judges and helpers and keeping us fed during the day.

Due to Claire & Nick's departure to the New Forest, and Langshot no longer being available for parking, we were unable to run formal Orienteering. We did coordinate 2 sessions around Woolgars Farm before it closed last September, which were enjoyed by those who attended. I'm pleased to say that we have two volunteers who will set courses at different locations this year, so Orienteering will be back.

A word from Team Manager - Marci

Get ready for this year's competitions by checking all the new regulations.

BRC Hat Tagging Guide for Competitors

Hat Standards – in order to ensure riders are wearing the most up to date riding hats, from 1st January 2023, PAS O15 1998 and SNELL 2002 will no longer be accepted. A new colour of hat tag will be required for all BE, PC and BRC activities from 1st January 2023.

BRC Body Protector Guidelines

Body protectors must be BETA Level 3 2009 or after purple label, or a blue 2018 label or after http://www.brcarea11.org.uk/Area11/wpcontent/uploads/2017/12/2018-BRC-BP-STANDARDS.pdf

Flu vaccination rules:

As part of the BHS, welfare of the horse is obviously paramount, however in the current climate the risk of a flu outbreak is at this time minimal. BRC are therefore comfortable to remove the requirement of a vaccination within '6 months and 21 days' of a qualifier or championship. This will be with immediate effect, however we will continue to strongly recommend a 6 month vaccination when attending BRC qualifiers and championships along with maintaining good bio-security protocols. In order to compete in a BRC qualifier and/or championships the annual vaccinations (12 month) and initial course must be correct as per G7 of the Handbook. BRC reserve the right to amend these vaccination rules should another outbreak occur. All horses must have a microchip – this will be checked at qualifiers and championships (any horse not microchipped will be eliminated).

HELPERS REQUIREMENT

For many events it is a requirement of entry that we provide a helper to the organisers for the day of the show. No special skills are required (although welcomed), and generally the help is required for a couple of hours. We have to provide the names of helpers at the time of entry, and so if anyone is willing to provide help in the future please let me know. This is a great way to see what goes on at these competitions, help in a discipline that you don't normally compete at, or for someone who enjoys the training and other facilities offered by the club, to help out.
