To tribute to our fellow horse lover, I thought it only appropriate to showcase some images of her in her element, onboard a trusted steed.



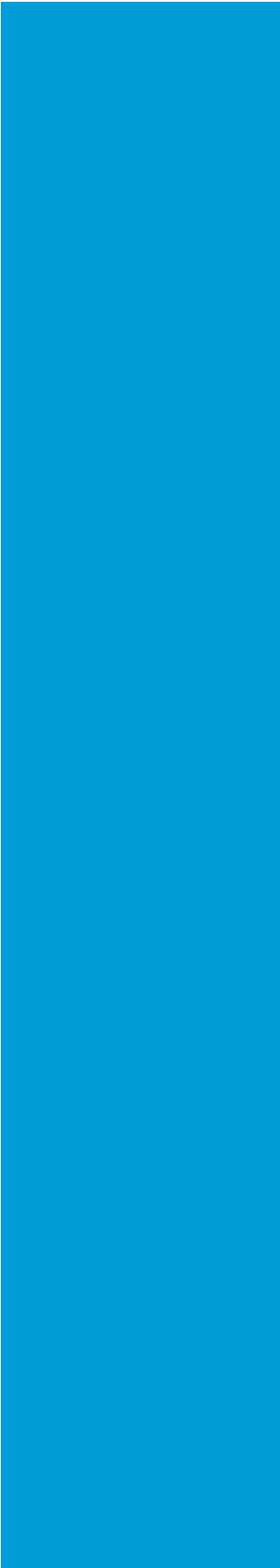
