Past Events we have organised for our Members

Saturday 12 October - LAW Bitting Solutions

On a soggy Saturday 3 riders and 4 horses braved the weather to learn about Bitting.

Laura started with Liz's horse Danny. Laura looked at the bits that Liz was currently using and the effect they were having on Danny, including how they sat in the mouth. She then explained the reasons why they were having difficulty with maintaining a consistent contact. Laura suggested a different type of bit. After a quick change they were back onboard and straight away there was a huge difference and Laura offered her advice on the elusive left lead canter and whamit happened !! Liz was thrilled to bits (pardon the pun).

The next attendee was Caro Long on her endurance mare, a new member to the club (welcome Caro). Caro found her little mare was unhappy in her mouth and could get strong. She was worrying that she was pulling too much on her horse's mouth. Laura spent her time taking her back to basics and tried her in a couple of bits, once again, finding a suitable bit which made an instant change. Caro was thrilled with the result.

Then came the turn of Liz with her other horse Mac. Mac loves his jumping a little too much and often Liz ends up losing control in his excitement with extreme speed. Laura highlighted that his bits

were actually fitting well and suggested adding a balancing strap might help. It made a big difference in their control. Liz has a Hunter Trial the next weekend so the perfect opportunity to test it out. Up next was Libby Straver and her young dressage horse Bertie. Bertie has grown into a very large boy big and powerful and Libby found he was being very fussy in the mouth and was wanting to find a bit to help keep him settled again. Laura used her expertise in assessing him and put him in a different type of snaffle. He was a lot happier straight off with a more constant relaxed contact.

All members would highly recommend Laura, Liz explained “there was so much I didn’t know about the horse’s mouth it was fascinating. I really enjoyed my sessions and looking forward to seeing the results.”

Today's lesson included (try to picture this), 4 trotting poles across the arena at both D and G, raised trotting poles on the $\frac{3}{4}$ line at E and B and then two sets of bounces with two strides in-between on both diagonals.

This was a great exercise to maintain balance, rhythm and control. Jade spent time going through all the different poles slowly adding them into the mix until finally all elements came together. Luckily Jade remembered the route and kept instructing everyone through.
