CAMP 2021



What a great time we all had at R/C camp, held at Boomerang Equestrian Centre near Hungerford. Arrival was on Friday afternoon and, after settling the horses and setting up tents etc, we collected our camp T shirts and wonderful goody bags provided by Equine Xceed, and went for a hack around the XC course to stretch the horses legs. This gave us the opportunity to have a look at the variety of jumps we would be jumping on Sunday and to introduce the horses to the larger than life models of the elephant and camel!

The first camp activity was the stretches for horse riders taken by Ali Williamson. This was easier for some than others and provided some hilarious moments, particularly when we had to pair up. Supper on Friday evening set the scene for the rest of the weekend – heaps of fabulous food, with plenty of choice, cooked by Caroline’s wonderful parents Norman and Vange. Whilst on the subject of food, there was also plenty of gorgeous cake throughout the weekend, courtesy of all the wonderful entries in the “Camp Bake Off” competition, won by the Biscoff Blondies, baked by Lucy Kirkby.

Saturday saw the show jumping sessions, generally in groups of 3 or 4, taken by Gemma Sayers and flat work (mainly in pairs) with Suzanne Holt. The huge SJ arena at Boomerang is filled with lots of brightly coloured fillers and wings and there was plenty to work on, leading up to a jump round the whole course. The flat work sessions went exceedingly well with many “lightbulb moments” to take away to work on. Some of the horses were given an “extra spark” after spotting the wallabies that live in the enclosure opposite the dressage arena!

Simone Highmore of Allen & Page was there on Saturday to weigh the horses and provide individual nutritional advice and diet plans, even providing vouchers for free bags of feed.

Another great meal on Saturday night was followed by the alcohol fuelled, hotly contested quiz, whilst we sheltered from the torrential rain in “The Shack”. Given the original weather forecast we were very lucky, with the rain being mostly restricted to during the nights. There were just a few slightly soggy tents and the need for a quick repositioning of some to inside the lorries!

XC on Sunday was coached by Georgie Spence. Great fun was had by all, splashing through the two water complexes and tackling the huge variety of fences, ditches and banks. We worked on position, pace and confidence and learning to trust your horse.

It was great to see lots of new faces at camp as well as some of the “old timers”, and horses of all shapes, sizes, colours and levels of experience.
