### **CDRC members Sue and Sandra put on their dancing shoes!**

On Friday 12th July, after a jaunt down the M4, a few over excited Proseccos and a hack round a field dodging elephants and camels, Sue, Caroline and I entered the smart outdoor arena at Boomerang at CDRC Camp. We three and our equines had been offered up as victims for a dressage to music demonstration put together by our esteemed Chairperson Sara Green.

There was a description of the session in the last newsletter, but the main thing I took from the session was how much of a difference the right music for the horse made to the overall picture. We have pretty different horses, Caroline an Iberian mare, Enriquetta, myself a cob x sports horse, Casey, and Sue's Ruby is a British Bred Warmblood mare. Enriquetta as the lightest horse, suited a 'tinklier' lighter music and Ruby a more powerful orchestra type.

Most importantly Sara stressed that the rider must love their music, this was something that became apparent to Sue and me during the next few weeks!

We all enjoyed the session immensely and soon discovered that conveniently there was soon to be a freestyle to music at Merrist Wood. I bit the bullet and entered at Novice level and Sue entered the Elementary. Sara had worked with Sue on her floorplan so she just needed to select the music. I needed both floorplan and music, so Sara sorted some music that I liked and Gary, my instructor worked on the floorplan - though Sara did shorten my canter as I was dying by the end of it! Sue was also on holiday a week before the competition so there's nothing like a last-minute rush! Sara came to watch our dress rehearsals and gave us a tweak and tips where necessary, she was incredibly supportive throughout.

The day dawned and I think it's safe to say Sue and I were indeed nervous, but excited. I tried to remember Sara's instruction of 'enjoy it' and also that my music had personal significance to me. It was another hot day so I was happy to be early in the morning and also relieved to be the only bronze rider (winner, winner, chicken dinner). We survived! We started and finished in the right places, Casey had started to anticipate a couple of moves, but all in all happy with the result, and buzzing for the next one!

Nearer lunchtime when the temperature had gone up considerably, Sue was boiling in the warm up, her time came and in she went. The strains of the Cirque du Soleil music began and off they danced, all went according to plan, nerves held together and Sue exited with a regional qualifying score, a great result for a first outing.

Having watched back our videos, we're both aware of improvements that need to be made and polish applied! Having notched up the first one, we're both looking forward to getting out dancing again. We were both delighted with the judge's comments regarding the suitability of our music and choreography, this had a major impact on our scores. Huge thanks to Sara for her assistance with this, it was a thoroughly enjoyable few weeks.

There are several of people in the area that can help put music together for you, once it's done, it's done! Just remember Sara's advice and make sure you love it - you'll be hearing it in your dreams!

Elizabeth May-Heggie won the Prelim 18 with another high score of 70.38%, knocking Siobhan into 3<sup>rd</sup> place with 69.62%.

In the novice 27, Sue Childs was our highest scoring member in 3<sup>rd</sup> place with 68.39%

A huge congratulations to all who competed. Looks like CDRC are going to have a strong dressage team for the winter and next year.

### **Sunday 29 September – Dressage with discussion – Suzanne Holt in Knaphill**

A 45-minute individual session with Suzanne Holt. Cost £25 members (£30 non-members)

Arrive prepared with a dressage test (you need to bring the test with you). Complete the test and Suzanne will make comments like a normal test judge. She will then go through a breakdown of the test with you, giving you pointers and instructional before riding through the test again.

### **Sunday 20 October – Beach Ride**

A very early morning start, meeting at Hayling Island at 07:30am for up to two hours on the beach.

### **Saturday 12 October - LAW Bitting Solutions - Knaphill**

An opportunity to understand what bit suits your horse's conformation. Bring your horse along and have a 1 on 1 appointment to check your horse's bit with no obligation to buy.

Charges are £55 per horse. The bits in stock are Informed Designs bits and the snaffles range from £70 to £85 and the training/jumping/Weymouths are £85 to £100. Laura will also work with Myler bits and Bomber bits.

All the bits are designed to improve comfort, welfare and performance. A session can take up to an hour per horse. We look at the horse on the ground checking conformation and how the bridle fits, we check your current bit collection. We then see the horse ridden in its original bit then discuss what is happening and make any changes that are best for you and the horse.

This is a team of 4 event with each member competing a different test.

- 1) BE90 Dressage 91 (2009) and 75cm Show jumping
- 2) BE90 Dressage 95 (2012) and 75cm Show jumping
- 3) BE100 Dressage 101 (2009) and 85cm Show jumping
- 4) BE100 Dressage 102 (2010) and 85cm Show jumping

Your horse must be vaccinated to compete at this area event.

There are also individual classes

- A) BE100 Dressage 106 and 75m Show jumping
- B) BE90 Dressage 96 and 85cm Show jumping

Finally, we have added a few more events to our 2020 plan which include, a polo lesson, ride in the New Forest and a 'ride and BBQ', so lots more to look forward to. Other ideas are always welcome.
